Stroke Team Care

Model of care typical in regional centres of Australia, maximsing existing available resources



Generalist care

Junior doctors supervised by generalist physicians



Allied Health

Generalist clinicians who may not have specialist expertise in Stroke



Standard Nursing

Nursing with no identified nurse stroke champions



Limited specialist access

Specialist care is not routine



BUILDS

Providing stroke neurology expertise to local teams



Virtual Stroke Neurologist

Video consult for all new stroke patients



Education program

Comprehensive site specific education modules



Coordinated care provided by nurses, doctors, and multidisciplinary team with specialist knowledge



Specialist care

Patient consulted by Stroke Neurologist or Stroke Physician



Professional development

Education opportunities for all team members



Stroke Coordinator

Dedicated team member to support both the team and the patient and coordinate care



Quality Assurance

Local audits and benchmarking to comparable health services

People who receive Stroke Unit Care are more likely to be **alive** and **living at home** 12 months after their stroke*.



* Absolute risk reduction: 2 more people survived, 6 more living at home or living independently per 100 patients compared to conventional care (Langhorne P, Ramachandra S:Cochrane Database of Systematic Reviews 2020)
